Favorability of Medicaid

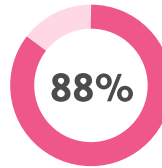


Three in four voters have a favorable opinion of Medicaid.



Adults are 5x more likely to have a favorable rather than an unfavorable opinion of Medicaid.

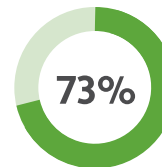

Funding for Medicaid



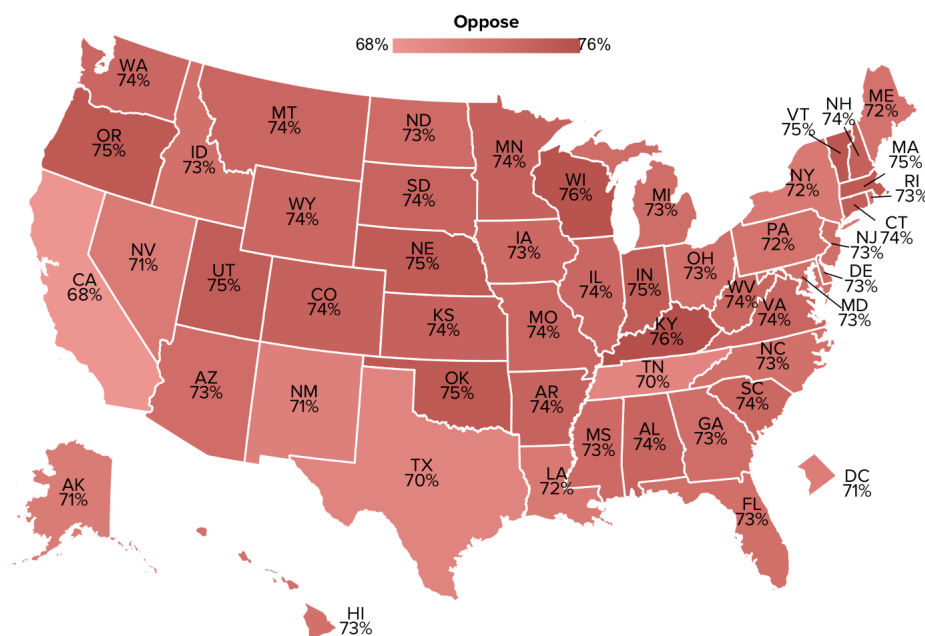
Overall, two thirds of voters oppose cutting funding for Medicaid, while only 24% of adults support cutting funding for Medicaid.



Opposition spans key states, with three-fourths of voters in key states (73%) opposing cutting funding for Medicaid.

Oppose cutting funding for Medicaid:



Morning Consult, on behalf of Modern Medicaid Alliance, conducted an online survey among a national sample of 10,026 registered voters. The interviews were conducted August 8-14, 2022. The data were weighted to approximate a target sample of registered voters based on gender by age, educational attainment, race, marital status, home ownership, race by educational attainment, 2020 presidential vote, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of +/-1%.
