

The Texas Medicaid program covered approximately 6 million beneficiaries as of March 2023, with approximately 97 percent enrolled in a Medicaid managed care plan. The state has five Medicaid managed care programs: STAR (serving pregnant women, families, and children, as well as aged, blind, and disabled adults in Medicaid Rural Service Areas and not on Medicare), STAR+PLUS (serving individuals with disabilities and the aged), STAR Health (serving foster children), STAR Kids (serving children and adults 20 and younger who have disabilities), the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), and the federal Medicare-Medicaid dual eligible demonstration, which is scheduled to end December 31, 2023. Texas is in the process of reprocurring all its Medicaid managed care contracts by the end of 2023. STAR Health contracts have already been awarded and will begin September 2023. STAR+PLUS contracts were awarded and will begin June 2024. An RFP for STAR and CHIP was released in December 2022, and an RFP for STAR Kids is expected between March and May 2024. Texas is not a Medicaid expansion state. Total Medicaid expenditures in Texas were approximately \$54.9 billion in fiscal 2022.
