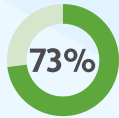


The Texas Medicaid program covered 5.3 million beneficiaries as of December 2021, with approximately 97 percent enrolled in a Medicaid managed care plan. The state has five Medicaid managed care programs: STAR (serving pregnant women, families, and children, as well as aged, blind, and disabled adults in Medicaid Rural Service Areas and not on Medicare), STAR+PLUS (serving individuals with disabilities and the aged), STAR Health (serving foster children), STAR Kids (serving children and adults 20 and younger who have disabilities), the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), and the federal Medicare-Medicaid dual eligible demonstration which is scheduled to end December 31, 2022, but has the option to renew for one more year. Texas is in the process of reprocurring all of its Medicaid managed care contracts by the end of 2023. A STAR Health RFP was released in October 2021, and a STAR+PLUS RFP in March 2022. An RFP for STAR and CHIP is expected in the state fiscal quarter beginning September 2022, and an RFP for STAR Kids is expected in the state fiscal quarter beginning March 2023. Texas is not a Medicaid expansion state. Total Medicaid expenditures in Texas were approximately \$45.3 billion in fiscal 2021.

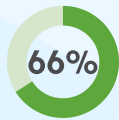
Texas Supports Medicaid
