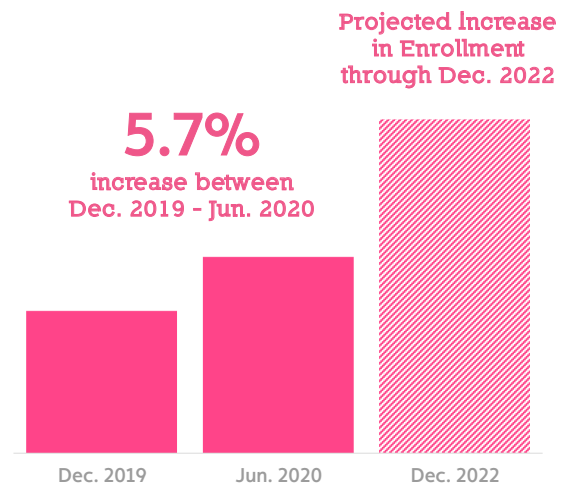


THE NUMBER OF AMERICANS RELYING ON MEDICAID IS GROWING

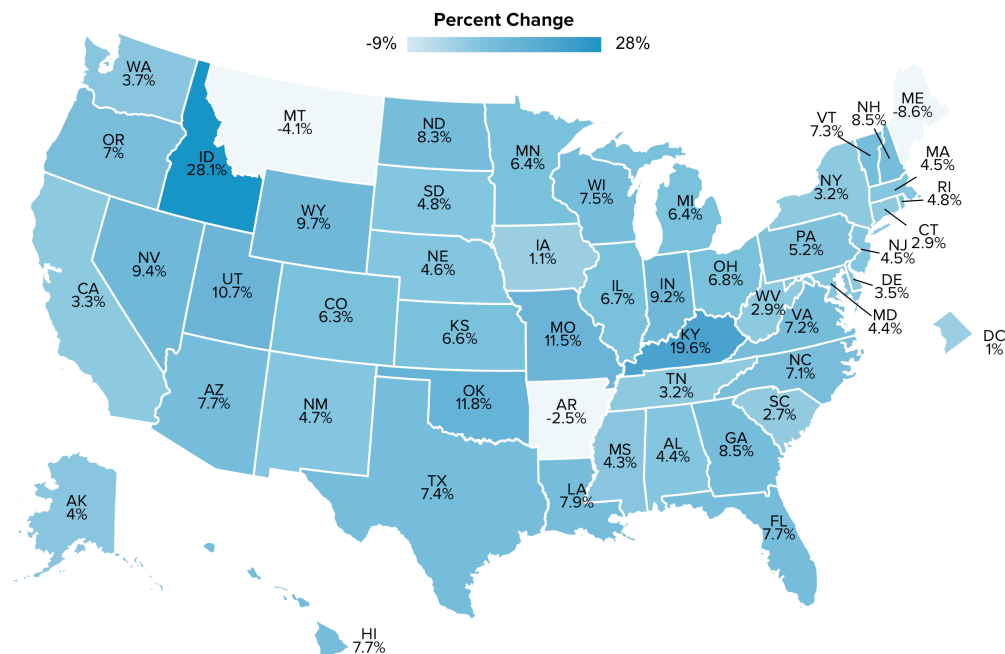
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Projected Increase in Enrollment through Dec. 2022
