Methodology:

This poll was conducted between May 15-May 20, 2019 among a national sample of 8801 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on age, educational attainment, gender, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 1 percentage points.
